Michele Eray | Sportscene - The Canoe Sprint world is flying into the 2nd year of the Olympic cycle, and with only a year

to go until the first round of Olympic

qualifications, 2014 should be a pretty exciting season.

The World Cups kick off in Milan, Italy on May 2nd, before moving to Racice, Czech from May 16-18th and then onto Szeged, Hungary the following weekend. Three beautiful

venues, and three opportunities to prepare for the World Championships in Moscow, come August 6th.

After a very busy month of May, the European countries will turn their focus to the European Championships in

Brandenburg, Germany from the 11th to 13th July. There are a few continental events taking place, including the Lake Placid International, NY, USA on July 6 & 7.

The Junior and U23 paddlers get to race their hearts out at one of the most crowd generating venues this year, as Szeged is hosting the Junior and U23 World Championships from the 17th to the 20th July. The Olympic Hopes Regatta takes place in Piešťany, Slovakia from the 12th to the 14th of September, and is a fantastic developmental opportunity for the sport.

With the world's eyes having been on Sochi for the Winter Olympics, Russia will be in the limelight again on August 6th - 10th with the ICF World Canoe Sprint Championships taking place in Krylatskoye , Moscow.

The Olympic Games were held in 1980 on the very same course, and since then major renovations have taken place, setting it up to host many international competitions including a World Cup and U23 Championships. With the standard of sprinting reaching new levels every year, the 2014 World Championships are sure to be a fantastic event.

ICF mulls Olympic poll answers





The International Canoe Federation received some 1300 responses to its recent questionnaire on the future of the Olympic canoe-kayak programme. (https://canoeing.wufoo.eu/forms/k2-men-200m/) The questionnaire was launched following the creation of an online petition which has over 2400 signatures to date (https://www.change.org/en-GB/petitions/international-canoe-federation-reconsider-removing-men-s-k2-200m-from-the-olympic-programme) expressing concern about the shape and structure of the future Olympic programme.

A vote was cast at an ICF board meeting in November to remove K2 Men 200m and replace it with the C1 Women 200m.

It is thought that some ICF board members were unhappy about the launch of the questionnaire, with several muttering that the decision making process should be led by the board and not open to some form of public consultation.

Board members who have spoken out hinted that the decision to drop the mens K2 200m will 'probably' get reversed later this month at the next ICF board meeting. But a men's kayak event is still going to have to go to enable the introduction of women's canoe in 2020 and to help equal up the balance between the genders. The new favourite to be dropped instead of mens K2 200m is the mens K2 1,000m event.
